John 8:43 Why do ye not understand my speech? even because ye cannot hear my word.

We think in pictures. We do not think in words. When you hear words you must see a picture or you haven't heard. Jesus said we do not understand His speech because we do not get the picture in His Word.

John 5:39 Search the scriptures; for in them ye think ye have eternal life: and they are they which testify of me.
40 And ye will not come to me, that ye might have life.

More Abundantly. Not just abundantly-but More Abundantly.

John 10:10 The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.

You need to start a class for leaders in your church. Furnish them with a "Book on How To"! Teach them from the Book so you are all on the same page. Make the word pictures clear in their mind by speaking the Word. You speak the Word and God will make the picture of His Word in their mind. God wants the whole world to see the same thing.

For some time now I have been enjoying a revelation about Luke, the Gentile Gospel Writer. There are sixty six Books in the Bible. Sixty four books were written by Jews, Sons of Abraham, and God's chosen people. Two were written by a Gentile, the group on earth I belong to. This fascinates me. I keep being drawn back to it because of its significance.

Why is it so significant? Luke is writing to the Gentiles.

1. Luke, the Gentile, wrote his Gospel and the Book of Acts to the Gentile Theophilus.
2. Luke, the Gentile, begins his history of God's New Testament Church earlier than the other Gospel writers with the story of God breaking His 400 years of silence.
3. Luke, the Gentile, tells us things not in the other three Gospels. (All of the Gospels do this.)
4. Luke, the Gentile, records more clearly the reason for the Cross in Luke 24:45 Then opened he their understanding, that they might understand the scriptures,
46 And said unto them, Thus it is written, and thus it behoved Christ to suffer, and to rise from the dead the third day:
47 And that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in his name among all nations, beginning at Jerusalem.
5. In Acts 2:1-4 Luke, the Gentile, tells us all about the beginning of the Church Jesus died for. All we know about the actual Day of Pentecost Luke teaches us.
6. Luke wrote to the whole world what Jesus said to do in Acts 2:38. Peter spoke it~Luke wrote it.
7. All churches must go back to Luke to find their beginning.

Luke requires a thorough study. I wrote a book called **"Luke in the Grip of Truth."**

What does the word "nothing" mean? It means Zero.

Gen 11:6 And the Lord said, Behold, the people is one, and they have all one language; and this they begin to do: and now "nothing" will be restrained from them, which they have imagined to do.

Every Leader and Witness should be required to read **"Luke in the Grip of Truth"** knowing once you see Luke's message in your mind nothing will be restrained in your witnessing about Jesus. You will be confident!
