

Habakkuk 2:2 And the Lord answered me, and said, **Write the vision**, and **make it plain** upon tables, that he may run that readeth it.

Luke 1:3 **It seemed good to me** also, having had **perfect understanding of all things from the very first**, to write unto thee in order, most excellent Theophilus,

4 That thou mightest know the certainty of those things, wherein thou hast been instructed.

Notice Luke's statement. Since I know something perfect, it seemed GOOD unto me also, to write it and let the Gentile world know, starting with you, most excellent Theophilus. The word "perfect" is a God word. It means the same in every language on earth. It describes God accurately. Luke had an accurate understanding of what God intended for man to do to be saved. Luke shared his perfect understanding with us in the Gospel of Luke and the Book of Acts.

You can't get any better than perfect. Perfect understanding means God confirmed the books of Luke and Acts to Luke perfectly with His Oath of "Surely I did It" when He inspired Luke to write scripture.

Acts 1:1 The **former treatise** (book of Luke) have I made, O Theophilus, of all that Jesus began both to do and teach. Both Books, the book of Luke and the book of Acts, were written to Theophilus.

Luke is the only writer in the Bible to give us the perfect History of the Church in the **Book of Acts**. All Churches must go back to the Book of Acts to find their perfect origin. All churches must perfect their church to fit Luke's perfect understanding.

I don't know why any scholar translating the Book of Luke would change the word perfect in Luke 1:3. The word perfect is the perfect word to describe Luke's understanding of God's revelation. God spoke directly to Luke and said "Surely I did these things." God inspired Luke to write perfect Scripture.

2 Tim 3:16 All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness:

17 That the man of God (that's us) may be **perfect**, throughly furnished unto all good works.

We are furnished with promises that are perfect and guaranteed to work if we work them by faith.

Heb 7:22 By so much was Jesus made a surety of a better testament. (than the LAW)

A surety means a guarantee. The word perfect comes with a guarantee from Jesus.

The goal is not perfection as such, but to stay redeemed thru perfect repentance.

Success is an open door God has set before all men. The decision to walk through that door is the responsibility of the man who sees it. God speaks to all men but many will not listen. They are taken up in their own ways and have no time for God. This is their biggest mistake.

The Bible is full of things we should run through our mind. The truly successful person is the one who gives God what He wants. Therefore my best advise to you is; "Give God what He wants." There is a freedom that comes into the life of a follower of Jesus. It is the freedom from the habit of the sins of the flesh. It is also a freedom from the sins of the mind.

Along with this comes the feeling of being in control of your life.

You become the land owner and not the hired hand.

You are in control and direct what is going to take place.

You are the master and not the slave.

You are the eagle in the sky and not the turkey in the barn yard.

You are free to enjoy life.

You are the person you were meant to be.

You have "The Perfect Law of Liberty" so enjoy it as God intended for you to do.
